It's summer before Senior Year – Here is what you can be working on!

	Plan a Visit : Visit as many college campuses as possible. If available, plan to take an
	official tour, plan a meeting with a department you are interested in, attend
	information sessions and ask lots of questions! If you can't visit, take a virtual tour!
	Read: Continue to collect and study college materials and literature. Be sure you are
	on the mailing and e-mail list for all the colleges you are applying for.
	Revise and Determine your College List: Start to seriously evaluate the colleges on
	your list as you visit and learn more. Note trends or characteristics shared by the
	schools that you like.
	Naviance: Move schools on Naviance from "Interested" to "I'm Applying".
	Write: Start writing the personal essays that you will need to send with your
	application.
	Get Organized: Start a spread sheet with deadlines and requirements for all colleges
	you are applying to. This includes application deadlines, essay requirements,
	supplemental information requirements, recommendations, transcripts and testing.
	Common Application has a useful requirements grid on their site.
	Brag Sheets : Prepare brag sheets for any recommendations you plan on requesting
	in the fall. Remember, teachers need MINIMUM four weeks' notice.
	Testing: There are a few ACT and SAT dates during the summer if you would like to
	retake either test.
	Common Application: Determine if you plan to apply to schools via CommonApp or
	through the school's application (note – the state schools may have a higher
	application fee if you go through the CommonApp). If you plan on using the
	Common Application, you can create your account now and connect it to
	Naviance.
	Act: Make early decision/early action preparations.
	Apply! State schools, such as ASU, will have their applications available and open
	online as early as July. Go ahead and apply but note- we will have application
	workshops in the fall.

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
